'Alavī, Bozorg (b 1904 Teheran), Iranian writer, one of the pioneers of modern prose. Of an old merchant family, he was educated first at home and then in Berlin, where he learned German. On his return he taught at the Teheran Technical School, at the same time beginning to write. Together with other young modernists he founded the famous literary circle *Rab'e* (see S. Hedāyat). His interest in politics brought him into an illegal Marxist group in Teheran, led by Dr Erānī. Along with 52 other members of the group he was arrested in 1937 and imprisoned until the amnesty of 1941, when a new ruler came to the throne. 'Alavī's first book was a collection of six stories, *Chamadān* (The Suitcase,

1934), with unusual, perverted characters for its heroes, such as the impotent opium addict of *Sarbāze sorbī* (The Lead Soldier), or people in abnormal situations like the father and son in love with the same girl, in the title story. Underlying the text is the author's Freudian interpretation of character and human relations.

In his later work, marked by the years in jail and his critical approach to the problems of contemporary life in Iran, he tried to drop this attitude. *Varāppārehāye zendān* (Prison Scrap-papers, 1941), a collection of short stories published soon after his release, presents the tragic fates of some of his fellow-prisoners. *Panjāh o se nafar* (The Fifty-three Men, 1942), a description of his arrest, interrogation and imprisonment, is of documentary rather than literary worth. The nine prose pieces in *Nāmeḥā va dāstānhāye digar* (Letters and Other Stories, 1952) include a suggestive lyrical picture of provincial life, *Gilamard* (The Man from Gilan), and the moving title story about the conflict between a Teheran judge devoted to the regime and his daughter, member of an illegal political group. His only novel, *Chashmhāyesh* (Her Eyes, 1952), is the story of a group of intellectuals working against the Iranian dictatorship at home and abroad, to bring about a more just social order; the two main characters, Mākān the painter of genius, uncompromising in his devotion to the cause, and the lovely Farangīs, wealthy and aristocratic but unreliable, bring the novel into the category of literature for the broad public. It has been translated into Polish and German. Since settling in Germany 'Alavī has changed his literary language and written several stories in German. Some of his books however are not in the field of *belles-lettres*, such as *Kampfendes Iran* (1955); an imaginary trip to the Iran of today and its traditional past, entitled *Das Land der Rosen und Nachtigallen* (1957); *Geschichte und Entwicklung der modernen Persischen Literatur* (1964); and a compendious dictionary, in collaboration with H. Junker, *Persisch-deutsches Wörterbuch* (1965). In addition to his own writing, 'Alavī translates Chekhov, Priestley, Schiller, Shaw and others.

Alamgir, Mohiuddin, born in 1943, he wrote *An analysis of national accounts of Bangladesh* (1972), *Bangladesh; a case of below poverty level equilibrium trap* (1978), *Famine in South Asia* (1980), and *The state of world rural poverty* (1992). LC

al-'Alamī, Musā, B.A., LL.B., O.B.E., born 8 May 1897 in Palestine, he was admitted to the English Bar in 1923 and two years later he was appointed to the Palestine Government as junior legal adviser, rising to the position of government advocate in 1933. He relinquished his government service in 1942 to take up active Arab political work, and was one of the principal negotiators with neighbouring Arab states on Arab League problems, on behalf of the Palestinian Arabs. When no agreement could be arrived at on the constitution of a unified Palestinian Arab committee, he was chosen as sole representative of all Arab Palestinian parties as the delegate to Arab unity conferences. After the establishment of Israel he sought and discovered adequate water in the Jordan valley near Jericho and founded there his Arab Development Society, the well-known agricultural training school for refugees and their children. He wrote *'Ibrat Filastin*, 2d ed. (1949). He died in Amman, 8 June 1984. Sir Geoffrey Furlonge wrote *Palestine is my country; the story of Musa Alami* (1969). Alavī, Buzurg, born 12 February 1904 at Tehran, he was educated in Iran and in Germany. In the early 1930s he taught at Tehran and became politically affiliated with Taqi Erani. In 1937 he was arrested for violation of a 1933 anti-communist law. He and fifty-two others remained in prison until the Allied occupation of Iran in the autumn of 1941. He became a founder of the Tudeh Party and editor of its party organ, *Mardum*. He was in East Germany when, in mid-August 1953 Musaddiq's nationalist government was overthrown. He remained in East Berlin, teaching Persian literature at Humboldt-Universität, and writing. He visited Iran briefly in 1979 and 1980, but returned to East Berlin, where he died on 17 February 1997. His writings include *Geschichte und Entwicklung der modernen persischen Literatur* (Berlin, 1964.) Grair O. Movsesian wrote *Творчество Бозурга Аляви* (1980). Jan Rypka, *History of Iranian literature* (1968)

Alavī, Hamza, born in 1921, he was in 1966 a Pakistani resident in Britain and vice-chairman of the Campaign against Racial Discrimination. Together with Fred Halliday he edited *State and ideology in the Middle East and Pakistan* (1988). LC
