When Modern Knowledge Enlightens Monotheistic Religions

Judaism, Christianity and Islam were not founded on legends or myths that would be related in the Bible or the Qur'an, as far as their prime and common roots are concerned, in other words the religious occurrences having marked the stay of the Hebrews in ancient Egypt. The history of the latter has in our days greatly benefitted from the newly acquired data of diverse disciplines of Egyptology. Thus, certain hieroglyphic texts, recent archaeological findings and modern medical investigations of mummies have contributed to a precise insertion of the religious events in the history of the country, this location in time having been

until now much debated. In this respect, today we know when Moses, a descendent of the first Hebrews who had entered Egypt from Palestine four centuries earlier, guided his brethren fleeing the country during the Exodus in their journey back to the Promised Land, the land of their ancestors. Is not the yearly commemoration of the Exodus the most important religious feast in Judaism?

The book reports a study of this stay to which the author devoted numerous years, comparing teachings of the Bible and events of the political history of ancient Egypt and establishing correspondences between the two. These teachings are compared with what the Qur'an relates about the same religious occurrences. In addition, other details of the Qur'an shed a complementary light on the pharaoh of the Exodus, corroborated by investigations of his mummy in the field of forensic medicine.
