

9504 LARCHER, Pierre. Un grammairien "oublié" : Ibn Mu'ī: Note sur son ouvrage en prose *al-Fuṣūl al-ḥamsūn*. *Histoire Epistémologie Langage*, 40 ii (2018) pp. 87-100. Ibn Mu'ī is a Maghribi grammarian who emigrated to the Mashriq, where he died in 628/1231. His *al-Fuṣūl al-ḥamsūn* is divided into "fifty sections" organised in five chapters. Its arrangement follows the *'amal* (lit. 'action'), which is in a relation of cause to effect with *'irāb*. This explains the priority given to the verb (ch. 2), which is considered the main governor, and the fact that all the other governors are brought together in ch. 3. That's an influence of the *Jumal* of al-Zajjājī (d. 337/949 or 339-340/950-952).
