

## Galgi Aletler?

DRUM Drums and tambourines have always been very popular instruments with the Arabs. According to their size, and the material used for their construction and shape they are known under different names. One of the oldest varieties, much in favour in pre-Islamic Arabia was a kind of square tambourine, the *duff*, a name to-day covering all kinds of tambourines. A standard instrument of the military bands throughout the caliphate, which is still common to-day in popular orchestras, was the *naqqārah* or kettledrum. Perhaps the most popular form to-day sold at all village fairs and everywhere by street vendors is the *dirbakah*, a bottomless earthenware vase closed at its wider end by tightly stretched goatskin parchment. The indispensable accompaniment for streetsingers and dancers, leaders of tame
