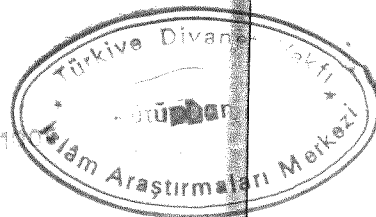

Jarrett, Henry Sullivan, born in 1839, he was educated at Bath. He entered the army and served in India in the Mutiny, and later in Afghanistan. A secretary and member of the Board of Examiners at Fort-William, his writings include an Arabic edition of the *Arabian nights* (1880), and the translation, *History of the caliphs*, from the Arabic of al-Suyūti (1880-81). Jarring, Gunnar Valfrid, born 12 October 1907 at Brunnby, Sweden, he studied at Lunds Universitet, where he received a doctorate in 1933, and where he subsequently taught Turkic languages until 1940, when he entered the Swedish diplomatic service. He was a sometime under secretary general and special representative of the UN Secretary General on the Middle Eastern question. His writings include *Matter of ethnological interest in Swedish missionary reports from southern Sinkiang* (1979), *Some notes on Eastern Turki (new Uighur) munazara literature* (1981), *Return to Kashgar, Central Asian memoirs in the present* (1986), and *Culture clash in Central Asia* (1991). In 1988 appeared *Turcica and Orientalia; studies in honour of Gunnar Jarring*. He died on 29 May 2002. Jarry, Jacques, born 20th cent., his writings include *Hérésies et factions dans l'Empire byzantine du IVe au VIIe siècle* (Le Caire, Institut Français d'Archéologie Orientale, 1968), and *L'iconoclasme* (Hiroshima, 1991). ZKO

Jarvis, Claude Scudamore, born in 1879, he served as a trooper in the Imperial Yeomanry in the South African war, then in Special Reserve Dorsetshire Regiment, 1902; he served in France, Egypt and Palestine, 1914-18, when he entered the Egyptian Government Frontier Administration, serving two years in the Western Desert; then two years as Governor of the Oases of the Libyan Desert with headquarters at al-Kharga; and in 1922 he was appointed Governor of Sinai, a post which he held until his retirement in 1936 with the rank of major. He was for some time a member of Council, Royal Central Asian Society. His writings, partly under the pseudonym Rameses, include *Three deserts* (1936), *Desert and delta* (1938), *Yesterday and to-day in Sinai* (1938), and *Oriental spotlight* (1952). He died in 1953. He was a professor at the Universität Berlin from 1931 to 1945, and the Universität Münster from 1947 to 1959. His writings include *Die Entwicklung des osmanischen Verfassungsstaates von den Anfängen bis zur Gegenwart* (1917), *Türkei* (1941), *Turecko* (Praha, 1942), and, jointly with F. Taeschner, *Aus der Geschichte des islamischen Orients* (1949). He died in 1983.
