**Myers**, Oliver Humphreys, born in 1903 at Shoeburyness, he was an archaeologist in the Middle East and during the war served with UK Intelligence in the region. He taught at Gordon College, Khartoum, and the University of Ibadan. His writings include *Some applications of statistics to archaeology* (1947), and he was joint author of *The Bucheum* (1934), and *The Cemeteries of Armant* (1937-40). **Mygind**, Eduard, born 19th cent., he wrote *Vom Bosphorus zum Sinai; Erinnerungen an die Einweihung der Hamidié-Pilgerbahn des Hedjas* (Constantinople, 1905), and *Syrien und die türkische Mekkapilgerbahn* (Halle, 1906). His trace is lost after a publication in 1908. GV

**Mylès**, Henri, born 19th cent., his writings include *La Fin de Stamboul* (1921), *Clair de lune sur le Bosphore; histoire orientale* (1926), *L'Autre carrière; scènes de la vie consulaire* (1927), and *Perdreux manqués* (1932). NUC, pre-1956

Freiherr von **Mylius**, Hermann, he was in 1967 affiliated with the Faculty of Agriculture in the Universität Kiel. His writings include *Nachkommenbeurteilung bei Bullen, künstlicher Besamung und Milchleistungsprüfung in England und Schottland* (1957). NUC, 1973-77

**Mylius**, Norbert, born 3 April 1906 at Wien, he studied law and ethnology at Wien until called to arms from 1940 to 1945. After his release from an American prisoner of war camp in 1946, he entered the Museum für Völkerkunde, Wien, and received his Dr.phil. in the following year. His interests ranged from Inonesia to Africa. His writings include *Afrika-Bibliographie, 1943-1951* (1952), and *Antlitz und Geheimnis der überseeischen Maske* (1961). **Mylrea**, Clarence Stanley Garland, born 19th cent., at London, he saw some service with the American Board of Foreign Missions in Turkey as a very young man, before his medical training at the Medico Chirurgical College and Medical School, Philadelphia. In 1906, he went out as a medical missionary to the Arabian Mission of the Reformed Church in America, at first stationed in Bahrain, and from 1913 onwards in Kuwait where he was still active in 1939. In his later years, he lived in Hartford, Conn., where his mimeographed memoirs, *Kuwait before oil; memoirs written between 1945 and 1951*, and edited by Samuel M. Zwemer, are deposited at the Hartford Seminary Foundation. Facey Grant; Van Ess

**Mynors**, T. H. B., born 1 August 1907 at Chippenham, England, he gained his B.A. at Oxford and became a sometime editor of *Sudan notes and records*. WhoEgypt, 1951

**Myntti**, Cynthia L., born in 1949, she was affiliated with the German Agency for Technical Cooperation, Eschborn, and wrote *Women and development in Yemen Arab Republic* (1979). LC

**Myres**, Sir John Linton, born in 1869 at Preston, Lancs., he was an archaeologist and historian. He prepared for the U.K. Naval-Intelligence Division *Dodecanese* (1943), and *Albania* (1945). His other writings include *The Dawn of history* (1911). He died in 1954. Bioln 3, 4; DBN; WHE&EA; *Who was who* 5

**Myrsiades**, Linda Suny, born 26 August 1941, she received a Ph.D. in 1973 from Indiana University for *The Karaghiozis tradition and Greek shadow puppet theater*. Between 1995 and 2003 she was a professor of English at West Chester University, Pa. Her writings include *The Karagiozis heroic performance in the Greek shadow theater* (1988), *Karagiozis; culture and comedy in Greek puppet theater* (1992), and she was joint editor of *Margins in the classroom* (1994). von **Mzik**, Hans, born 24 July 1876 at Rzeszow, Galicia, he studied at Wien and Leiden and received a Dr.phil. in 1903 at Wien for a study of the Arab wazirate entitled *Das Vezirat bei den Arabern*. Since 1903 he was associated with Österreichische Nationalbibliothek, Wien, concurrently lecturing at the Universität. His writings include *Erdmessung, Grad, Meile und Stadion nach den altarmenischen Quellen* (1933); he edited *Das Kitāb al-Wuzarā' wa-l-kuttāb des al-Gahšiyārī* (1926-28), and *Das Kitāb Sūrat al-ard wa-l-kuttāb des al-Huwārīzmī* (1963).
